

Dame Marina will always be remembered for the warm and loving person that she was, her research and knowledge of Spanish Dance that she shared with everyone, her input in our wonderful syllabus, and promotion of Spanish Dance everywhere she went in the world. We are so grateful for the role she filled so brilliantly and enthusiastically, and the path she laid for her successors to follow...

INTRODUCING OUR NEW HONORARY LIFE PRESIDENT- SIR GEOFFREY NEIMAN

Sir Geoffrey was honoured to receive a KNIGHTHOOD "CRUZ DE OFICIAL DE LA ORDEN DE ISABEL LA CATOLICA" in 1999 from His Majesty King Juan Carlos of Spain.

He was a member of the famous Antonio Ruiz's Company" then joined "Luisillo Spanish Dance Company." whilst with the company for five years, they toured and danced globally. They joined "Paco Ruiz's" group, touring Europe. Geoffrey then returned to South Africa to partner Mercedes Molina in her Spanish dance company.

Geoffrey was a founding member of the Spanish Dance Society and choreographed the complete male syllabus. Additionally, he put his energy, experience, and knowledge into teaching and examining the SDS syllabus. After many successful years with the Mercedes Molina Company, and a lifetime partnership with her until her untimely death in 1978, he carried on running the company until he retired from dancing in 1982.

Since the last Newsletter of Winter 2021 we have been super busy creating, notating, and videoing the new SDS Vocational Programmes of Study (POS).

New choreographies have been added to the syllabus and generously donated to the SDS by Ana Morales, Fernando Galán, Marco Flores, Manuel Liñan, Marta de Troya, Nuria Garcia and Victoria Ramos.

We now have five Vocational Grades with the added elements of improvisation, and direction and teaching skills. Personal research undertaken by the students culminating in a written Journal and personal discussion with the visiting examiner has been welcomed as a replacement to the original theory section. We are very proud of our new syllabus because it contains a smoother learning curve from Intermediate to Professional Development levels, and all the new dances are now musically correct. We appreciate the fact that this means they are longer because they have not been cut for exam purposes. We felt this was a very important aspect that needed including in our training method because teachers and students will be able to experience and assimilate the correct musical phrasing of all the Palos. In fact, they have already noticed that the dances are easier to remember because they have a natural consecutive flow and final completion.

We have also been busy training some more examiners (we hope you will enjoy reading some of their CVs in a later section of this newsletter) and have held numerous examiner standardisation meetings to aim to sort out discrepancies and to create a more universal standard among them. All the examiners also had training days with GQAL to cover the General Grades and Vocational (POS) Marking Systems.

This year we welcomed to the fold of examiners: Esperanza de los Reyes, Carmen Martinez Martinez from Spain, Grazia Maugeri from Sicily, Georgina Jacobs from South Africa, and Katerina Voulgari from Greece.

GQAL finally announced that by the 1st of March 2023, we had full Ofqual accreditation of our Vocational Programme of Study. Therefore, we could go ahead and enter the backlog of senior students from Greece, Italy, Malta, and Spain. We thank the teachers and students for their patience and dedication to the SDS training method.

We have also been reviewing our eight General Graded exams, so that the Specifications' assessment and marking criteria come in line with the Vocational Specifications which means the final Profile Mark Sheets will reflect the standard of the candidates': Dexterity, Braceo, Zapateado, Vueltas, Ritmos, use of Attire and presentation of Dances alongside the Musicality, Performance Skills and Knowledge and Understanding. Subsequently the General Grades videos and music files will need to be spliced together differently to reflect the new assessment and marking criteria. Odette Kurland and I will do this in the autumn.

In January 2023 my ex-student Lara Darwazah who is currently living in Jordan approached us to help start an SDS centre in Amman the capital. We helped her with some sponsorship and arranged for Katerina Voulgari to teach 4 consecutive weekends starting on the 29th of April. There was excellent feedback from the participants, and they are preparing to take the Grade 2 examination in the Autumn. Katerina is also performing at the local tapas bar to raise interest and inspire more students to attend the courses.

On the 29th of April, Deborah McNamara presented a performance in Malta as a tribute to Sherrill Wexler which was very successful and well attended. Gary and Cheryl White happened to be in Malta visiting family so could attend and represent the SDS Executive Committee UK and Europe.

In London, we presented a tribute to our ex-Honorary Life President Dame Marina Keet de Grut at a Gala Performance of Danza Española at the Bloomsbury Theatre on the 16th of July. Inmaculada Ortega performed alongside other artists and SDS members from Greece, Malta, Spain, and the UK. Cheryl White has written a review of both tributes for you to read below.

Inmaculada also taught on our first SDS London Summer Course held at the newly refurbished City Academy premises in Farringdon, from the 12th to the 15th of July. TO THE UK AND EUROPEAN EXECUITIVE COMMITTEE

It's amazing that Cheryl ended up being a dancer. Her mother tried taking her to ballet lessons when she was 5 years old, but she was so painfully shy that it was decided to try again the following year. Her ballet training thus began at the age of 6 with the Diana Jahlokova-Vorps Dance School in Toronto, Ontario and by the age of 9, she joined the Canadian Junior Ballet Company.

When Cheryl was 13 years old she won a scholarship to the National Ballet School of Canada. It was here, in her senior years at the school, that she started Flamenco classes with the inspirational Susana y Antonio Robledo. It was this couple who influenced her decision to return to Flamenco dance many years later. At the NBS, Cheryl was the sole recipient of the Cecchetti Advanced Syllabus exam – honours standing.

After graduating, she was awarded a Canadian Council Arts Grant to continue her dance studies abroad in London.



CHERYL WAS INVITED TO JOIN THE LONDON FESTIVAL BALLET COMPANY (NOW KNOWN AS ENGLISH NATIONAL BALLET). DURING HER TIME WITH ENB, SHE PERFORMED MANY MAJOR ROLES, TOURING ACROSS BRITAIN AND AROUND THE WORLD – IN SOUTH AMERICA, U.S.A., AUSTRALIA, CHINA AND THROUGHOUT EUROPE



She was also a founder member/dancer of the Education Unit of the company – demonstrating the ballet repertoire in colleges and universities within London.

Cheryl's freelance career included film work, dance education programmes in schools, and teaching professional ballet classes and repertoire in London, Spain and Iceland as well as guest appearances with other dance companies in London and Germany.

During a 1 year post graduate course in musical theatre at the London Studio Centre, she was chosen to co-star with Wayne Sleep in his production of Bits and Pieces followed by Andrew Lloyd Webber's Song and Dance.

While freelancing, Cheryl trained with the wonderful Conchita del Campo of the Spanish Dance Society, completing all her exams. On the day of passing her Tercer Año Estudiante with Honours, she proceeded to video the entire Escuela Bolera for the Maestro de Baile with Dame Marina Keet accompanying on castanets. This was a five-hour marathon!

Cheryl is a qualified Level 3 teacher registered with Ofqual, and a founder member of the Body Control Pilates Association where she trained and examined teachers for 26 years, She is also a certified Bowen Technique Practitioner and a Rejuvanessence Therapist.

Since retiring from teaching, she has returned to dancing – her first love.

She feels privileged to be accorded the position of Deputy Chair for the SDS.

Eleni Giannopoulou-Athens, Greece Flamenco Dancer-Choreographer-Teacher From an early age Eleni studied Spanish dancing with the great Lola Greco, Manolete, Raphaela Carrasco, Farruquito, El Guito, and Belen Maya, where through their love and affection she was not only taught to dance but also learned the philosophy and culture of flamenco.

As a flamenco soloist she has performed in the most honoured theatres of Greece, some of them being the National Opera of Greece, the Athens Concert Hall, Ancient and historical theaters, Rex Theater, Veakion and many more.

Being a member of various quadros flamencos such as "MACANDE". "SOLERA", "SOLEA" and more, she has performed in theatres and peñas of Spain-Seville, Berlin, Munich, Nuremberg, Cyprus, Albania along with others, accompanied by some of the most famous figuras flamencas like El Perla, Manuel El Tañe, Paco Iglesias, Alfredo Tejada, David el Galli, El Bonela Hijo, Andres Martinez, Luis El Salao, and El Picuo. The pinnacle of her career consists of the highly acclaimed performance "Callico Flamenco" where she danced in a duo with flamenco idol José Maya and were both praised by the audience in the Athens Concert Hall in 2014.

Eleni has been a dance partner of the great Oscar De Los Reyes for the years 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015 respectfully, with additional tours and sold out performances such as "Tentacion Flamenca" and "Flamenco Alchemy" which were accompanied by the string Orchestra 'Intrati'.

GRAZIA MAUGERI

Profesor de Baile y Bailaora

(Catania 18/03/79)

She began studying classical ballet at the age of 5. Adding at the age of 11 also the study of Spanish dance, which from 1994 onwards deepened with masters such as Franca Roberto, Simona De Paola, Marc Aurelio and Antonia Moya.

She is the Artistic Director of the Academia de Baile Flamenco y Danza Española "Juerga Flamenca" of Acireale (CT). From 2008 to 2019, she collaborated with guest teachers such as Pepa Molina, Marta Jimenez, Miguel Angel Espino, Manuel Reyes, Cristina Benitez and Amelia Vega. In 2010 some of her photos were selected for the Photo Exhibition "La Plasticidad de flamenco". She is the only Italian artist published in the Spanish magazine "La Guia de Flamenco". Also, in 2010, she was included among the flamenco artists in the International Arena, in the online magazine "Flamenca, que mire Usted?".

In 2013 she received the Certificado Artistico from the Spanish Dance Society. In 2014 she received the award "Katania Creativa", and in 2016 the award "Pianeta Venere", which recognized her merits in her commitment to spreading flamenco and Spanish dance in Sicily (Italy).

From 2000 onwards she studied in Madrid (España) at the Academia de Baile Flamenco y Danza Española "Amor de Dios" with internationally renowned masters such as Enrique Pantoja, La Tati, La Truco, Paco Romero, Maria Magdalena, Cristobal Reyes...


In 2016 she participated in the Seminario de Flamenco y Danza Española organized by Carmela Greco, and in 2017 "Amalgama Flamenca" both held at the "Amor de Dios" de Madrid (España).

In 2004 she began her studies of the Spanish Dance Society Syllabus with Maria Luisa Ihre in Rome.

In 2012 she obtained her diploma Profesor de Baile Flamenco y Danza Española Cat. A (S.D.S.). Since 2015 she has been a member of the "International Dance Council" (C.I.D.) – UNESCO.

In 2015 she was the flamenco face of the exhibition "Pablo Picasso and his Passions" performing at Castel Ursino and Cappella Bonajuto (Catania), Palazzo Corvaja (Taormina), Palazzo D'Amico (Milazzo).





MARIA LORCA MONTOYA

MARIA LORCA MONTOYA (Mandy-Lee Wiegmans) was introduced to the dancing world at a very young age under the tutorship of her parents, Josè & Helena Montoya. Besides doing Spanish dancing with her parents, she also studied ballet and modern dancing with Diane Cassidy, but Spanish dancing soon proved to be her only passion.


Since the age of six years, she has been part of the Josè Montoya Spanish Dance Theatre's annual productions of España at the State Theatre, Pretoria. She performed with her parents at the Sun City Superbowl in 1993. In 1997, on a trip overseas, Maria was invited to perform as guest artist at the famous Viva España Restaurant, in the beautiful countryside of Valencia, Spain

On returning to South Africa after a year of travelling abroad, she performed with the internationally renowned choreographer and performer Antonio del Castillo, in both a theatre production (España '99) and a music video, which he directed, "La Luna, Luna". She participated in Sylvana Gironi's production of 'Carmen' at the Johannesburg Civic Theatre, as well as in 'Del Alma' whereafter she was nominated for a FNB Vita Award in the category 'Most Outstanding' Female Dancer'. Maria Lorca has been asked to perform as a guest artist for a number of studios in Johannesburg, as well as for the Rosa Jimenez Spanish Dance Company in Sasolburg (where she also presented a Technical Course for Rosa's students in 2011).

She has also performed with The South African Ballet Theatre, adding a flavour of true Spanish dancing, in their productions of Carmen (2002) and Swan lake (2004). She has also taken part, with the Helena Montoya Spanish Dance Company, in three productions of 'Valentines Enchantment' at the State Theatre, Pretoria, working with The Black Tie Ensemble.



Maria Lorca has attended various courses with teachers brought out from Spain by The Spanish Dance Society and Alianza Flamenco, such as world renowned Victoria Ramos, La Tati, Inmaculada ℰ Domingo Ortega and Angel Muñoz. Besides attending the 2000, 2002 and 2003 Spanish Dance Society's Summer School in London, she was invited to teach at this summer school in 2005. Besides doing regular show work (cabarets in and around Gauteng / performances with Ch2 Guitar Duo and Mischief Guitar Duo). Maria teaches from her newly built studio at home in Garsfontein, Pretoria as well as at Pro Arte Alphen Park High School where they do Spanish dance as a subject.



Maria has qualified for her full Juniors and Seniors teachers (IdB and PdB) with The Spanish Dance Society and is also an Examiner with the Spanish Dance Society. She has also gained her junior teachers with Alianza Flamenca.

Maria & her dancers were privileged enough to dance for Adidas and their guests at the final of the FIFA World Cup in 2010, at Soccer City in Johannesburg. By invitation of Dirk Badenhorst, Maria performed at the Lyric Theatre, Gold Reef City, in the 'Young Ballet Stars of the World' Gala event alongside her dancing partner, Rosa Jimenez. This led to an exciting event In June 2014, where Maria and Rosa were invited to perform at the world famous Busan International Dance Festival (BIDF) based in the marine capital of South Korea. This festival brought together 34 performances from 11 countries in Asia, **Europe, Latin America, the United States** and Africa. Rosa and Maria performed two flamenco choreographies which were well received by the International Audience.

The greatest honour and achievement, however, is when Maria and her husband Frans became parents in May 2009, to their beautiful daughter - Hailene Rose and in 2012 to another blue eyed beauty - Keah Madalene.





CARLI OLIVIER

Carli Olivier was born on the 7th of February 1984 in the Free State, South Africa. She started ballet at the age of 4 with Rosemary and Bart Saayman. A few years later she attended her first Spanish dance class and this soon became her passion and dance style of choice. Carli won the Mercedes Molina bursary for her Tercer Año Estudiante examination and later completed her Instructor de Baile and Profesor de Baile certificate under the tutelage of Rhoda Rivkind.

In 2004, Carli opened her own studio and started annual studio productions featuring Carli Spanish Dance Productions student dancers.

Today we stand proud with Compañia Sophia as its own entity. They have been performing with some of the best in the arts industry, on many a stage in South Africa, and continue to be positively influenced and inspired during annual travels to Spain.



VASSILIS SKEPETARIS

EXAMINER-JUDGE-COACH-TEACHER-DANCER-MUSICIAN



Vassilis Skepetaris has been occupied with dance and classical music since the age of ten. He has a Fellowship and is an Examiner of "International Dance Teachers Association" (IDTA). He possesses numerous certificates in dance: Fellowship in Ballroom, Fellowship in Latin, Fellowship in Freestyle, Fellowship in Cheerleading, Licentiate in Viennese Waltz, Licentiate in Rock n Roll, Diploma in Argentinian Tango, Diploma in Salsa, Stunt Diploma in Cheerleading, Profesor de Baile in Spanish Dance (SDS) for 20 years, Level 4 in dance Teaching in Ballroom (IDTA), Level 4 in dance Teaching in Latin (IDTA), Level 4 in dance Teaching in Freestyle (IDTA) and Level 4 in dance Teaching in Spanish Dance (SDS). He is also a Qualified Judge and Coach for Performance Cheer and Cheerleading "International Cheer Union" (ICU).



He has been a cheerleading champion in Greece for many years. He is a tutor of Spanish and Ballroom dance and prepares candidates for the professional title of Level 4 for IDTA and SDS. He has prepared more than 50 candidates for IdB and PdB of SDS and more than 50 for Associate, Licentiate and Fellowship of IDTA. He is a representative/president in Greece for the "Majorette Sport World Federation" (MWF). He has studied Professional music at Philippos Nakas, Orpheo and Apolonion Conservatories including studies on Theory, Harmony, History of Music, Morphology of Music, Analysis of musical instruments, Dictee, Prima Vista, Piano, French Horn, Saxophone. He has studied dance in Spain in the following dance schools: Amor de dios, La Union, Centro Andalúz, Clara Ramona studio, Centro de Baile Jerez with famous dancers and teachers like Andres Marín, Inmaculada Ortega, Antonio Canales, Juana Amaya, Javier LaTorre, Eva la Yerbabuena, Rafaela Carrasco, Timo Lozano, Ciro, Clara Ramona, Tomás de Madrid, Paco Valenzuela, Bolito Vargas, Isaac de los Reyes, Viictoria Ramos, Fernando Galán, La Tati, La Chiqui, Conchita del Mar, Pepe Ruíz, Candela Soto, Gemma de la Cruz, Adolfo Vega, Lola Greco, Angel Munóz, Miguel Angel Espino, and Charo Espino.

He has accumulated many years of teaching experience in dance schools in Spain at the "Centro de Baile Jerez" in Andalucia and in a "Spanish and Classical dance school" in Valencia. In Greece at the Diana Theodoridou Dance School, Imperial Dance School, Dance Fever school, Roula Papadimitriou Dance School, Maria Stamataki Dance School, Maria Lazaridou Dance School, Elli Paraskeva Dance School. In 2000 has created the "Plaza de Baile" Dance School and in 2002 the dance group "Danza Flamenca Grupo". He has appeared both as a choreographer and a dancer in popular theatres such as the Herodium Theater, Nacional Opera of Greece, Badminton Theater, Athens Concert Hall, Thessaloniki Concert Hall, Pallas Theatre, Veakeio, Acropol, Kalouta, Katia Dandoulaki, Municipal Theatre of Volos, Municipal Theatre of Andros, National Theatre of Rhodes, Municipal Theatre of Rhodes, Municipal Theatre of Loutraki, Municipal Theatre of Kos, Festival of Symi, Festival Edipsos. He has directed and choreographed for performances of: Carmen, Salome, Orfeo y Euridice, Medea, and Don Quixote. Presently he is teaching the SDS and IDTA syllabus plus open classes and is preparing various candidates for exams, He is also preparing pupils for cheerleading Championships.

He is an examiner for the IDTA, Judge for ICU and IDTA, he plays the saxophone as a member of Philarmonic Orchestra and he is teaching classical music at the National, Thoukididio, and Aristotelio Conservatories. This year he has won an SDS President's Award for service to the SDS with his excellent IT skills.



I was born in Pretoria, South Africa in 1974. At the age of 3 my family relocated to Sasolburg due to my father's work. I started ballet at the age of 6 and Spanish dancing at the age of 10 with the Bart Saayman & Rosemary Bana School of Ballet and Spanish Dancing in Sasolburg. As long as I can remember, all I ever wanted to do was dance and paint. Most of my youth was spent in the dance studio and the beautiful Etienne Rousseau Theatre in Sasolburg performing in annual shows & eisteddfods.

In 1994, I won the Mercedez Molina Bursary for the best exam candidate in Gauteng. Two years later I moved to Pretoria after completing my Advanced exam to complete a BTech degree in Fine Arts (Cum Laude) at the University of Tshwane and to further my dancing career with José & Helena Montoya Spanish Dance Theatre. I performed with the company for three years appearing at theatres all over the country as well as dancing regularly at Vive España Restaurant in Midrand.

In 2001, I decided to move to London in the hope of travelling and seeing the world. It was here that I met Conchita del Campo for the first time. She encouraged me to teach Spanish dancing. It was under her tutelage that I qualified as an Instructor de Baile for the Spanish Dance Society. Thereafter, I began teaching part-time at the London Dance Studio in Kings Cross for Conchita & the Gypsy Dance Booth in Watford. I copresented Sevillanas courses at the City Literary Institute & similarly assisted Isabella Pachero at the Bishops Gate Institute.



They took me to see Almagro, very close to Ciudad Real, famous for its Corral de Comedias from the 17th century, the only one that remains intact from that time and where one of the most prestigious theatre festivals is held every year. There we enjoyed some good typical tapas of the area, accompanied by pleasant conversation. A million thanks to both of you!

Then from Ciudad Real to Málaga, where a very friendly driver from the Casares Town Hall was waiting for me, to travel the hour's journey to Juana Ma Gil's school, who was there waiting, as it was getting dark, to welcome me and enjoy a dinner together while sharing concerns, points of view and teaching methods. It was such a real pleasure to meet her! It was time to rest to face an intense day of exams the next day. All of Juana's students were wonderful, and you could clearly see her teaching methodology, dedication, and enthusiasm. It's a shame to have almost no time after the exams to continue talking. Thanks for everything, Vicki! It was time to travel again, this time to Valencia, also sharing the exam session with my partner and fellow examiner Esperanza de los Reyes. Sandra Sasera was waiting for us there, with her gorgeous students already prepared to start the exams. A very rewarding experience seeing all the students who did their best to demonstrate everything they had learned. Thank you, Sandra, for your hospitality and for the time we spent after the exams to catch up.

It was time to go home again and prepare for end-of-year festivals, etc., and then face the last exam session in Spain at the Centro de Baile Jerez, under the direction of Victoria Ramos. It was a real pleasure to see her students, who exuded art and passion through every pore of their skin, with excellent technical work. It was also satisfying to see that all of them were examined for the Spanish Dance Route, something that is not very common these days. Vicki has always encouraged her students to learn the Classical and Regional styles as an invaluable part of their overall Spanish Dance training. Thank you, Vicki, for your love and for always making everything so easy!

Furthermore, after the exams, another important and wonderful event related to Spanish Dance began. For another year, and with great success, "Fama Flamenco" was celebrated at the Centro de Baile Jerez. Masterclasses for all levels are taught by Marta de Troya and Pilar Ogalla. This year, as a novelty, I taught an Estilizada course and have donated the choreography to the Spanish Dance Society, to become part of the alternatives that exist in its Syllabus. All this work culminated with a beautiful show at the CajaSol Theatre in Jerez de la Frontera, which showed, among other things, everything learned during that intense week of training, coexistence, laughter, and, above all, a lot of art, on the part of of all the participating students, who gave their all on the stage, making it such an enjoyable experience for everyone.
